



Prepare your Travel Trailer or Fifth Wheel for Transporter

1. **For safety considerations all LPG/Propane should be in the off position.** Remember... if your LPG/Propane tanks are not empty, we may be restricted from using certain tunnels and/or bridges. If we have to travel "out of route" you will incur additional charges.
2. Your trailer must be registered, roadworthy and all lights and brakes in good working order.
3. Make sure your furnace, water heater, stove and oven are in the off position.
4. Make sure your refrigerator is empty and turned off. We cannot be responsible for spoiled food.
5. All items inside your travel trailer or fifth wheel such as kitchen utensils, plates, cups, food, etc. should be PROPERLY secured.
6. Personal belongings and equipment must be itemized and verified by our driver prior to shipment. Anchor Motor Freight assumes no responsibility for missing items not fully accounted for in writing.
7. All cloth or canvas covers should be removed prior to shipment. Covers can rip or shred or cause cracks and scratches to your trailer while in transit. Please make sure covers or tarps are removed and secured in RV prior to pickup.
8. All doors and windows should be locked shut and the locking device taped over.
9. Make sure your fresh, gray and black water tanks are drained and clean.
10. Cabinet doors and drawers and all lockers inside the RV should be secured shut.
11. If your trailer is a "Toy Hauler": ATV's, Motorcycles, Sand Rails, Dune Buggies, etc... are allowed and are to be secured prior to pick up. Anchor Motor Freight assumes no responsibility for damage to vehicles or to the RV as it is loaded by the customer.
